From Rocinha, Rio's largest and most spectacular favela, to Sapopemba, a ramshackle suburb on the outskirts of São Paulo, Brazilians are struggling to survive. 'We live in fear' bears witness to their day-to-day ordeal – a catalogue of anxiety, dashed hopes and casual violence. Amid the despair, many of these photographs capture a tenderness, the soul of a people yearning for a better life.

Genna Naccache is a Brazilian photojournalist and film maker. Working in her native Rio (2002-2005), she followed street fighting between drug gangs and police in Rocinha, shared the hopes and dreams of women inside the Talavera Bruce prison, and saw the birth of a new favela, Nova Invasão.
