Austria	AI Austria	Push for MPs declaration
Belgium Flemish	AI Belgium Flemish	Promoting viral action through website, e-magazine, and with AI student and local groups
Czech Republic	AI Czech Republic	A stand in front of the houses of parliament, distribute leaflets related to the Week of Action and explaining the need for support of the Declaration of Parliamentarians in favour of ATT. Distribution of leaflets and cards - 1) use the viral action to push the Czech parliament for support of ATT and 2) send a postcards to a representative of some foreign government forcing it to support ATT.
Denmark	AI Denmark	Push parliamentarian action in September after launch of 'Blood at the Crossroads' report
France	AI France	Push collection of signatures from parliamentarians. Promotion of viral. Projection of ARTE film. Launch of the Blood at Crossroads report
Germany	AI Germany	Launch of the Blood at Crossroads report
Greece	AI Greece	Parliamentarian Action--sending letters, World is Watching media stunt during WoA, using viral action
Hungary	AI Hungary	Participate to massive stunt out of parliament
Iceland	AI Iceland	Promotion of Parliamentary Declaration - promotion of the Control Arms viral - media work around the AI report and possible World is Watching stunt.
Ireland	AI Ireland	Media launch of the report "Blood at the Crossroads" and photo-op with one parliamentarian from each party who has signed the declaration and all Senators who have signed - Symbolic handover of poster which says "I signed the declaration ..." Event to take place outside Leinster House, Dublin
Macedonia	CIVIL	World is Watching photo stunt
Netherlands	AI Netherlands	Will distribute report to Ministry of Foreign Affairs, media, and members of Parliament, no membership outreach expected
Poland	AI Poland	Stunt event in front of the Polish Parliament in Warsaw
Portugal	AI Portugal	Sending personal letters to each parliamentarian to gather signatures for declaration, will put up huge World is Watching poster in the parliament during WoA, will promote the viral campaign, and will promote an arms "quiz" for members to send to the Ministry of Defence - Launch of the report "Blood at the Crossroads: making the case of an ATT through a press conference or special pack to journalists

Slovakia	AI Slovakia	Organise World is Watching photo stunt with 80 activists from 4 countries (Slovakia, Austria, Czech Republic, and Hungary) outside Parliament during WoA (perhaps will also get supportive MPs to join picture), will create media pack for WoA, will organize public photo CA exhibition in two Slovak cities in mid-October
Spain	Control Arms alliance	1. email petition (15 September) 2. stunt in front of the MoFA to lobby the Spanish Gvt to have a proactive role in the UNGA and 1st Committee.
	AI Spain	Launch and promotion of the viral in the week of action - major stunt with big glasses on 23 September
Sweden	AI Sweden	Promote parliamentary declaration in coalition with the Parliamentary Forum on Small Arms, hope to collect at least 100 more signatures by October.
Switzerland	AI Switzerland	Try to organise a World is Watching stunt photo outside the Parliament in mid-September, will continue to push the parliamentary declaration with MPs
Turkey	AI Turkey	Promotion of AI report and video
UK	Oxfam GB and AI UK	1. Action cards targeting Foreign Secretary (throughout Sept) 2. Media work around 'Blood at the Crossroads' (AI only) 3. Possible stunt in London during the week of action
	Oxfam in Scotland	Screening of the film 'Ezra' about child soldiers in Sierra Leone during the Take One: Action film festival in Edinburgh on September 13 <sup>th</sup> , followed by a panel discussion, with invitation to take action ahead of the ATT week of action (using the 'world is watching' action card) with Des Browne (UK Defence Minister), a Sierra Leone journalist/academic Amadu Wurie Khan, Simon Bateson from WDM Scotland who spent 18 months doing election monitoring in Sierra Leone, plus an Oxfam person
